Course Title ET101-res: Hebrew 1 (Residential)

This course provides the student with an introduction to the phonology, **Course Description**

morphology, vocabulary, grammar, and syntax of Biblical Hebrew. Course helps include translation and analyses of selected passages in the Hebrew

Bible, with quizzes, exams, and a final comprehensive exam.

Course Objective By means of the careful reading and study of the assigned Hebrew grammar, completion of the workbook assignments, class discussion and workshops,

quizzes and exams, the student will be able to:

1. Write the Hebrew alphabet, vocalize Hebrew vowels, identify vowel

classes, and to understand Hebrew syllable structure

2. Identify and inflect basic Hebrew grammatical forms

3. Parse Hebrew verbs in any stem and conjugation

4. Recognize and translate Hebrew vocabulary that appear frequently in

the Old Testament.

5. Utilize lexical and grammatical tools to translate a more extensive verse

of Hebrew narrative

Course Methodology

The students and professor will meet at assigned times to work through the chapters of the grammar and workbook. The teacher will quiz the student over the material throughout the semester and give the student a comprehensive final exam at the end of the semester.

Course Requirements

Student must satisfactorily complete the following course requirements:

(1) General

The student is required to attend all lectures, participate in class discussions and exercises, and do the assigned homework. If a student misses a lecture, he is responsible to read the appropriate chapters in the grammar, to complete the exercises, and to take the quizzes and exams that were covered in class. No late work will be accepted for credit except approved of by the professor.

(2) Grammar & Workbook

Students are required to read each chapter of the assigned Hebrew grammar at least twice before the date listed below in which the chapter(s) in view will be discussed. In some cases, the student will be required to complete the workbook exercises before the class period in which the chapter they cover will be discussed. In some cases, the student will be required to work on the exercises during and after the class period in which they are discussed. The instructor will check the student's workbook periodically to ensure that he is completing the assigned exercises. Students may not consult the workbook answer keys without the instructor's permission. The instructor may suggest or hand out other reading materials for the energetic student, though not mandatory for course credit.

(3) Quizzes & Exams

The student must complete a total of 8 quizzes and 4 exams. The quizzes and exams will usually be administered at the beginning of the class sessions. The final exam will be administered and proctored sometime after the last class.
